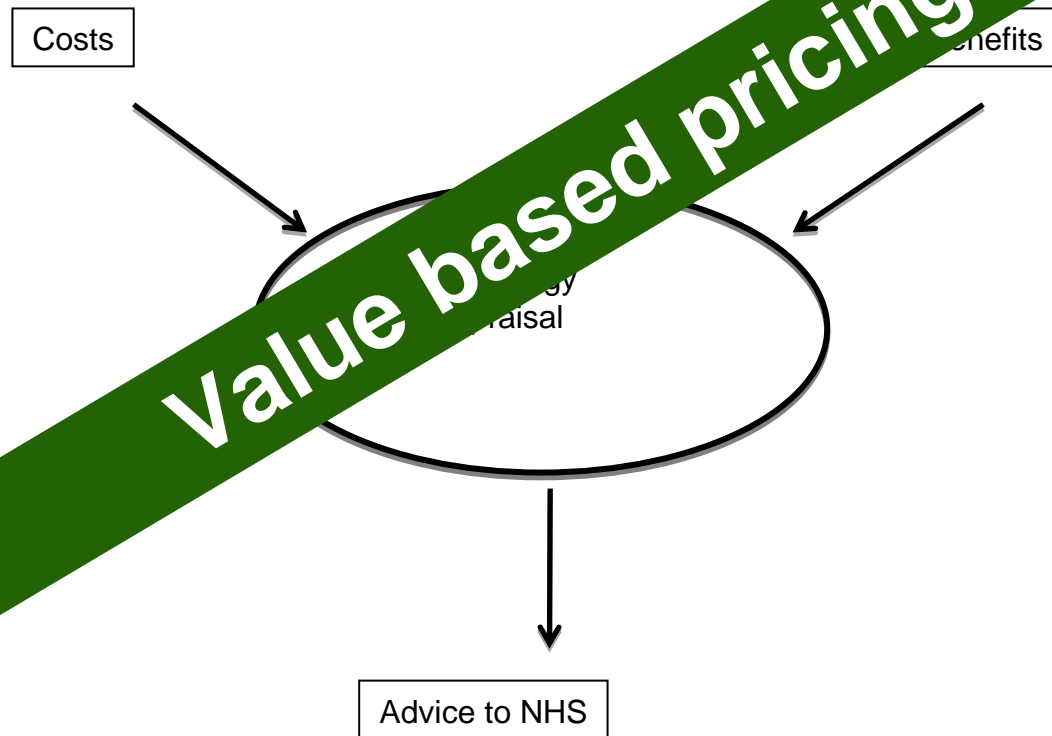
Changes at NICE

4. New programmes

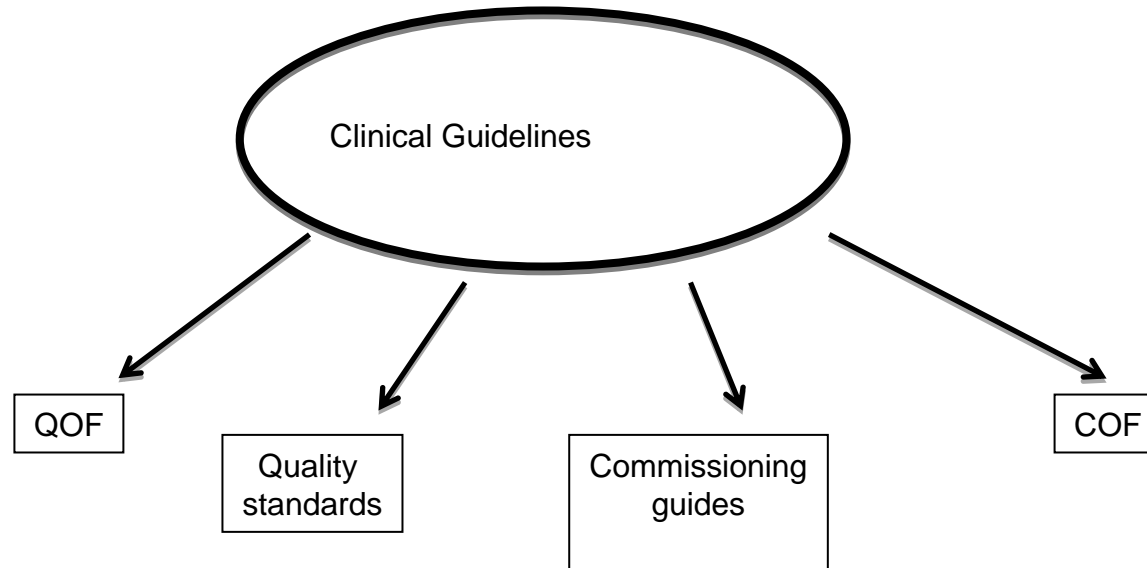
New Health Bill
